CLEANING THE WOUND

Gently clean the wound each day with mildly soapy water and rinse well. Use a moistened Q-tip to remove any crust or film that may develop. Afterwards, apply an ointment like Polysporin, Bacitracin or Vaseline, to keep the area moist (DO NOT use Neosporin). A Band-Aid is optional, but may be advisable if the wound is located in an area that may be easily injured by clothing, glasses, etc.

PAIN

Pain medication is seldom required after most skin surgeries, however, regular strength Tylenol (DO NOT use aspirin) may be used as needed.

BLEEDING

Although a mild amount of oozing may be expected, frank bleeding is a rare complication of Dermatological procedures. Should you experience bleeding, apply continuous direct pressure with a clean gauze or washcloth for 15 minutes. If the bleeding does not stop, or if any other problems develop, please call us at the number listed above.
